11th April 2024 Dear Parishioners and Friends,

As you probably know, our readings each week come from a three year lectionary. One feature is which Gospel is read in Sunday services - Year A we read mainly from Matthew, Year B from Mark and Year C from Luke (the Gospel of John is used along the way in all three years). This year we are in Year B and because the Gospel of Mark is shorter than Matthew or Luke we read more from John's Gospel at times – one of those times being the Easter season. Something else about Easter is that we always read from the book of Acts for our first reading instead of from the Old Testament or Hebrew Bible. Additionally, in

Year B during the Easter season our second reading is from the first letter of John. This gives us an opportunity to look at this letter in some depth.

Most scholars agree that the Epistles of John were written after the Gospel of John. They may be responses to events hinted at in the Gospel of John and what the author sees as misunderstandings or misreadings of key ideas in that Gospel. This text is not really a letter, more an early Christian homily. We find exhortations, verbs in the imperative (telling people how to behave and act) and directing of their priorities both ethically and morally. The author constantly refers back to the theology of John's Gospel. As such they are addressed to a Johannine community and deal with the deep controversies of early Christian identity. There is very strong language, as you read it, think of a preacher in full stride.

Whilst addressed to what is probably a group of Jewish Christians, there has been division – some have gone out into the world, which is a dubious and dark place. The language of John's epistle is very dualistic, reflecting its ancient context. As such, when we read this letter we need to pay attention to the underlying message of the text, rather than taking the dualism at face value. The question the letter gets us to ask is 'how do you form community identity in our world?'. When we transpose this question to 21st Century Australia, we must not simply replicate the dualism. Many problems in our own world come from a dualistic outlook. In our context, we don't form identity in a dualistic way – we cannot use terms like 'black or white', 'in or out', 'right or wrong'. In most cases using dualistic language in the 21st Century is really unhelpful.

How does this letter help us to think about the question of community identity? Well, I think in this epistle, as we will come to see in the weeks ahead, it is about framing our relationships in love. It is more about <u>how</u> we live in community with each other. It all fits rather nicely with our current diocesan strategy and our Lenten Studies, don't you think? Shalom, Rev'd Justine
